As the nation's first historical society, the MHS strives to enhance the understanding of our nation's past and its connection to the present, demonstrating that history is not just a series of events that happened to individuals long ago, but is integral to the fabric of our daily lives. At the MHS, we believe that historical insight is critical to creating a better world. Everyone is welcome to draw upon our collections to encourage a richer understanding of our past.

In the complex world in which we live today, it is imperative that the MHS take an active role in defining what it means to interact with history. We use our resources to educate, connect, and inspire. Through its rich archives, exhibitions, educational workshops, and programs, the MHS engages withMHS engages with the public, promotes the relevance of history, and helps to improve the understanding of the role of civics in public life. MHS Audience + Events Attendees

- The MHS database contains 24,000+ unique households.
- MHS Membership represents approximately 600 households, 85% of which are located in the Metro Boston area.
- · Save the Date and Gala invitations are mailed to approximately 1,500 households.
- The 2022 Gala hosted nearly 400 guests, many of whom represent Greater Boston's leadership in financial, legal, real estate, medical, and higher education institutions, along with elected and civic leaders.

MHS Education Initiatives

The MHS seeks to promote history and civics education as one of the nation's premier resource providers for K–12 educators. It supports innovative and best practices in teaching history through teacher training, online resources, fellowships, and National History Day in Massachusetts. Signature programs include:

History Source

Historysource.org provides primary source sets for K–12 social studies, ELA, and civics classrooms. These sets are drawn from MHS collections and highlight voices of the many people who changed Massachusetts and the nation. The website is free and searchable, and each primary source set includes student-friendly descriptions, transcriptions, adapted texts, and other tools and resources. More source sets will be released throughout the school year.

National History Day

National History Day (NHD) in Massachusetts is an educational program sponsored by the MHS to equip students with the necessary skills to succeed in college, in their careers, and as active, engaged citizens. It is a year-long interdisciplinary program for students in grades 6–12 that focuses on historical research, interpretation, and creative expression. Students choose a historical topic and conduct primary and secondary source research, presenting their work through various mediums. They have the opportunity to compete for prizes at local, regional, state, and national contests. NHD prioritizes student-centered learning, boosts student performance in all subjects, improves 21st-century skills, and fosters an understanding of democracy and community engagement. NHD students are shown to outperform their peers in reading, science, math, and social studies 2:1, yet only 1% of eligible students in MA currently participate in the program.

- 4,000+ students from 63 schools in MA participated in 2023
- · 60% increase in student participation since 2021
- 50% MA gateway cities have participated since 2018

Teacher Workshops

The MHS develops and implements workshops on American history where educators gain access to first-rate primary sources from MHS collections and learn strategies for how best to use them in the classroom. Teachers engage with expert scholars, visit historical sites, and participate in peer-to-peer learning. Offered both virtually and in person, these single- to multi-day workshops deepen teachers' content knowledge and build confidence in their own practice, resulting in more effective instruction and better student outcomes.
